Letter to R.M. ? Uiahu, June 29th 02

- trouble at Rakwa; raiding in which VC's BUNDU (Uiahu) DOGEBI (Tiaopa) and NUNIS (Wanigela) implicated

- pigs, dogs, gardens - 3 women raped

"Following this the Uiahu people paid another visit on their own account pretending that ~~they~~ they had authority from your Government & behaved in much the same manner killing 2 pigs, stealing property then outraging 2 women."

- notes several letters for which no copy kept. (check at government archives in C.M. M.'s files).

Sept. 3, 1903

- letter concerning a Cons. PAMU of Cape Nelson Detachment who wanted to marry a RARABI of Uiahu and left 8 sticks of tobacco with one of men & instructions to take her to Cape Nelson

- she & Poth against, so PJM. returned tobacco and asked M. to tell PAMU to lay off

- M. indicates that some correspondence over this

Letters about runaway carriers apprehended; absent school boys

Aug. 13, 1904 - application for 2 blocks of 5 acres ^{9320A.} at Uiahu, the latter for coconuts.

May 30, 1904 - Letter from J.N. - (Nogor?) - copy
"Dear Mr. Money:"

You know man name Iaru who live at Sibiribiri he came to me after you left and gave me 2 stick tobacco and 2 g Bellnut. he say policeman name Dio ask him to bring his daughter to Rainu and he may sleep with her and he to not like that he would to told the government on them"

- Delrichs investigated & sacked const.

Nov. 18, 1904 - Uiahu St,

- disturbance at U. in which Clement Qaitavora involved

- Kapi kapi had left an unseaworthy canoe at the creek on this way to Tufi and now returned and camped

Some Maisin came down to look them over, and settled on the damaged canoe, refusing to budge when asked to - a Maisin said "Go die" adding "buy me of your number on one of the islands & then go home."

- Kapihapi were blood relatives of Clements', and he, tired of the slighting way the Maisin spoke of them all the time, fetched ~~his own~~ Money's old rifle and fired off a couple of shots, saying "If you want war go & fight the Doriri or come & take me but do not hurt us with your words." (Money was not there at the time and the SSI was ill in his house).

Application for 200 Acres at Uiakeu apparently deferred.

- Doriri raid upon Sibiribiri
- temporary residence erected at Uiakeu
- complains that the site selected by the Bishop is too far from the school & church to allow convenient supervision.
